



Democratic Resilience – The Role of Academia and Civil Society

Democratic resilience is increasingly being tested by polarization, rising support for populist-authoritarian politicians, and institutional backsliding. Across liberal democracies, citizens' trust in each other is eroding, as is their trust in democratic institutions, processes and politicians. How can that trust be rebuilt? And why have we made so little progress despite a tremendous amount of experimentation? This discussion will explore what role academia and civil society can play in answering this question and why it is essential that we connect evidence-based insights from science with the practice-based knowledge of civil society initiatives.
